Cité du Temps, Biel-Bienne

Start your excursion in Biel, the world capital of watchmaking. The "Cité du Temps" with the Omega Museum and Planet Swatch is a journey through the historical heritage of these iconic Swiss brands. The extraordinary construction designed by architect Shigeru Ban will be sure to impress you. omegawatches.com/planet-omega/heritage/museum



Vineyard trail & old town La Neuveville

Drive along the northern shore of Lake Biel, known for its picturesque vineyards and scenic landscapes. Stop by the villages of Twann and Ligerz and pay a visit to the charming village of La Neuveville with its old town and idyllic lake promenade. This is an area where you can learn a great deal about regional wines and traditional viticulture. j3l.ch/en/



St. Peters Island

«Nowhere have I felt so truly happy as on St. Peters Island» wrote Jean-Jacques Rousseau. The peninsula, a nature reserve, can be reached by foot from the pretty town of Erlach via a 4 km long romantic trail called Heideweg. Treat yourself to a glass of wine from the vineyards of the St. Peters Island in the historic monastery hotel. j3l.ch/en/



Palafitte on Lake Neuchâtel

We continue to the Hotel Palafitte for lunch, a souvenir of the Expo.02 and the only hotel in Europe built on water. Modelled on pile dwellings, it provides a real feeling of the Maldives. Bon appétit! palafitte.ch/en/



Laténium – Pile Dwelling Museum, Neuchâtel

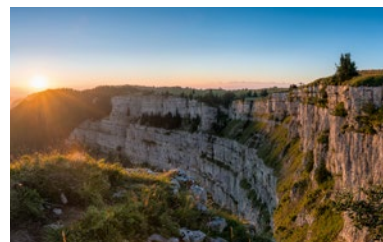
Neuchâtel

The beautiful university city of Neuchâtel boasts a well-preserved medieval old town, a historical castle and a church from the 12th century. Charming boutiques, cobblestoned streets, sunny terraces and an impressive architecture make of it a highlight on this route. j3l.ch/en/



Center Dürrenmatt, Neuchâtel

The Dürrenmatt Center was designed by Ticino-based architect Mario Botta and invites you to an exhibition devoted to the literature of the famous writer and dramatist Friedrich Dürrenmatt (1912-1990). cdn.ch/cdn/en



Creux du Van

Continue to the small village of Couvet until reaching the restaurant Soliat. The gigantic rock arena 'Creux du Van' will only be a stone's throw away, which is a natural formation offering one of the most spectacular views in Switzerland. j3l.ch/en/

Your return journey to Bern takes you to the protected natural reserve of Mont Vully. Visit one of Vully's 24 family-run wineries on Lake Murten for your well-earned afternoon snack and wine tasting. The AOC Vully sits astride two cantons, which is unique in Switzerland. vully.ch
