## Kunstmuseum Bern

Switzerland's oldest fine art museum with a permanent collection ranging from Gothic times to the present. With currently over 4,000 paintings and sculptures as well as around 45,000 drawings, prints, photographs, videos and films, it boasts not only one of Switzerland's leading collections but also international renown.

## Kunsthalle Bern

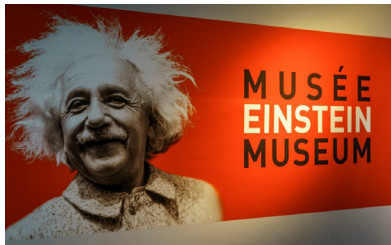

## Zentrum Paul Klee and Children Museum Creaviva

Zentrum Paul Klee, designed by Renzo Piano, houses the world's largest collection of works by Paul Klee and presents exhibitions on major modern and contemporary artists. It goes beyond a traditional museum, offering temporary exhibitions, guided tours, concerts, theatre, readings, and workshops at the Children Museum Creaviva.

## Historical Museum of Bern with the Einstein Museum

The Bernisches Historisches Museum is one of Switzerland's most important history museums. Its collection is a cultural repository of the history of Bern and the world. The Einstein Museum, which is integrated into the Bernisches Historisches Museum, presents the life of the physicist over an area of around 1000 m<sup>2</sup>.

## The Einstein Haus

In this Bern apartment, Albert Einstein (1879–1955) wrote his five key scientific works around 1905 while living with his wife Mileva Maric and their son. Restored to its original state, it lets visitors step into the world of the scholarly couple.

## Natural History Museum Bern

This is one of the leading natural history museums in Switzerland and comprises one of the largest diorama displays in Europe. Its 220 showcases feature a remarkable range of domestic and exotic birds and animals. The Natural History Museum of Bern attracts some 100,000 visitors every year.

## Museum of Communication

The museum, featuring a wide range of interactive exhibits, explores the evolution of communication and its technologies from past centuries to the present day. In 2019, it was awarded the Council of Europe Museum Prize. It was founded in 1907 as the corporate museum of the Swiss Post (PTT).

## Swiss Shooting Museum
